UNIVERSITÉ DU QUÉBEC À MONTRÉAL (UQÀM) – Transfer Rules

Procedures for Université du Québec à Montréal (UQÀM) Students to Take a Course at Another CUEE Member University for Transfer Credit to their UQÀM Program

1. UQÀM graduate students currently registered in a program, who wish to undertake studies at another institution for transfer credit toward their graduate program at UQÀM need to first of all:
 - i. Apply at the Conférence des recteurs et des principaux des universités du Québec CREPUQ, specifying the host institution, program and course
2. Once the CREPUQ approves the course, the student will informally approach the institution offering the course to ask for permission to take the course:
 - i. For CUEE students, that will mean confirming the availability of a course (checking the CUEE website) to make sure that the course is being offered when the student wants to take it; and
 - ii. confirming how to secure permission from the host institution to take the course.
3. Once UQÀM approves the course, the régistrariat will send the written application to the proposed host institution.
4. UQÀM students can be registered in courses at UQÀM and in another university in the same semester. If permission is granted to take a course at another institution, the student must either take a temporary leave of absence from UQÀM or register concurrently in a non-course option such as the Co-op Work Term at the Université Laval.
5. Tuition fees must be paid to either the home or host institution.
6. Students must make arrangements for an official transcript to be sent directly to the régistrariat upon completion of the course work. Typically, the hosting university will send the final grade directly to the Graduate Admissions and Records office and the Faculty of Graduate Studies.
7. Course costs fluctuate. Please check current University of Victoria Calendar.

Procedures for Visiting Students to Take One or More Evaluation Courses at UQÀM for Transfer Credit

1. Prospective students should review the course offerings that will be available in coming semesters.
2. The student must obtain approval in writing du registrariat ou l'équivalent at their home institution to take the UQÀM course for transfer credit.
3. If under 21, must submit proof that he has completed his high school or college.
4. In all cases, the student must provide a birth certificate.
